



## Webinar Will Focus on Adult Learners

Administrators, instructors, and counselors who work with adult learners at ABLE programs, career centers, colleges, and universities are invited to participate in a webinar, "Breaking the Soft Skills Barriers" on **Thursday, August 15 at 3:30 PM.**

Education providers continue to look for partnerships and strategies to help adult learners become aware of their soft skills competencies and deficiencies, particularly for the hardest-to-serve and at-risk populations. Students who complete certificates, degrees, and other workforce training but lack dependability, time management competencies, interpersonal skills or professionalism diminish their chances at success in the workforce. During the one-hour webinar, two organizations will share their experiences with helping students gain soft skills. Presenters include Kathy Atkinson, Lauren McGarity and Najmuddeen Salaam.

Atkinson is program director for education with **Mercy Neighborhood Services**, a social services agency and provider of ABLE services for Cincinnati Public Schools. Mercy Neighborhood Services has established a process for identifying soft skills competencies and deficiencies, and directing learners to the appropriate course of action.

The **WinWin Institute for Response-Able Re-Entry** is an educational program of WinWin, Inc. for incarcerated adult learners. The Institute integrates the teaching and learning of employability and personal enrichment skills. McGarity is WinWin's founder and also a director of special projects at the Ohio Board of Regents. Salaam graduated from the program, is now part of WinWin's staff, and is a finishing specialist with TNT Graphics in Columbus. He also authored and continues to facilitate the Institute's Helping Ourselves Pursue Excellence (HOPE), a mentorship program for inmates.

## House Bill 2 Signed by Governor John Kasich

Governor John Kasich yesterday signed House Bill 2, sponsored by Representatives Tim Derickson and Tim Brown. The legislation requires individuals receiving unemployment compensation to use [OhioMeansJobs](#) and its tools to aid in their job search.

In summary, HB 2 helps individuals receiving unemployment compensation accelerate their job search by requiring them to register with OhioMeansJobs as a condition to receiving benefits.

Through OhioMeansJobs, an individual will be required to post a resume and will receive a weekly listing of available jobs in their area of interest and experience.

Additionally, HB 2 requires those receiving unemployment benefits to report to their local One-Stop office for additional supports and services beginning with the eight consecutive weeks utilizing the benefits.

## Chancellor Visits Pike County Career Technology Center

As part of a recent statewide tour to highlight the higher education aspects of the new biennial budget, Ohio Board of Regents Chancellor John Carey visited the Pike County Career Technology Center to discuss the state's efforts to promote post-secondary education and career preparation among adults.

Carey, joined by other Ohio Board of Regents staff members, spoke to administrators of the ABLE (Adult Basic and Literacy Education) program from around the state and other education leaders from the region. Carey told the crowd of nearly 100 that Pike County's ABLE program enrolled 361 adults in fiscal year 2012, with a student retention rate of 78 percent, which is higher than the state target of 75 percent.

"Of those students enrolled, 40 later enrolled in post-secondary education training," Carey said. "Eighty-five unemployed adults became employed, and 37 adults achieved their GED."

Carey said Pike County's ABLE program is one of the first in the state, and has been in existence for 48 years. He said Ohio's ABLE programs play a vital role in meeting the workforce needs of the state.

"ABLE gives students the opportunity to accomplish their goals, and that helps to make Ohio a stronger state," Carey said.

During the visit to Pike County, Carey heard from two adult students who have benefited from the ABLE program in Wellston, Carey's hometown. The group from the Board of Regents also visited an ABLE site in Wellston as part of the day.

sharing their learning with program colleagues afterward.

There will be two strands offered at the Teacher Academy: 1. Reasoning through Language Arts & Social Studies; and 2. Mathematical Reasoning & Science. Instructional teams must coordinate their registration to ensure that one team member attends each strand. Each strand runs the full two days of the Academy and addresses content knowledge in the subject areas, instructional strategies, and classroom implementation of new techniques. Program administrators are encouraged to attend both days of a single strand. It is strongly recommended that participants take the Mission Possible series of professional development, available on the PDN calendar, prior to attending the Academy.

Each of the three individuals from each program is eligible to receive a \$200 stipend to offset

travel and lodging expenses. The stipends may be paid to an individual or the program may invoice the Ohio Literacy Resource Center for the funds; combinations will be allowed (e.g. two people on an invoice and one person paid a stipend). Additional participants beyond three per program may not be eligible to receive the \$200 stipend.

Registration will be open until noon on Aug. 23. If at that time it is determined that we have not reached capacity, registration will be reopened from August 26-29 to allow for additional registrants on a first-come, first-served basis.
