EVIDENCE DID NOT SUPPORT ALLEGATION AGAINST EMPLOYEE AT PUBLIC UTILITIES
COMMISSION OF OHIO
Columbus, Ohio, May 30, 2013

The Ohio Inspector General has issued a report of investigation today concluding the evidence did not support an accusation of wrongdoing leveled against a Public Utilities Commission of Ohio employee.

The investigation, which was conducted in conjunction with the Ohio State Highway Patrol, was initiated after a complaint was received from the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio. However, the investigation did not reveal evidence to show the gas pipeline safety compliance investigator, a 13-year veteran employee, had violated either the law or the policies of the state agency.
